## CLN4 Disease

CLN4 Disease belongs to a group known as the Neuronal Ceroid Lipofuscinoses, previously collectively referred to as Batten Disease. They have since been renamed to reflect the causative gene and the age of onset. This form is characterised by problems in the storage of proteins and certain fats in the nerve cells and other cells leaving them unable to work properly and leading to the symptoms of this disorder. Symptoms can begin anywhere between teenage years and adulthood but most commonly present around the age of 30. Symptoms are progressive and may include seizures, dementia, ataxia, tremors, speech difficulties and involuntary movements.
