Cystathioninuria

Cystathioninuria is a metabolic disorder caused by a deficiency of the cystathionine gamma-lyase enzyme. This causes high levels of cystathionine in the urine. The condition is generally mild in most individuals and most often responds to vitamin B6 (pyridoxine). In several cases Cystathioninuria has been linked with intellectual disability.
